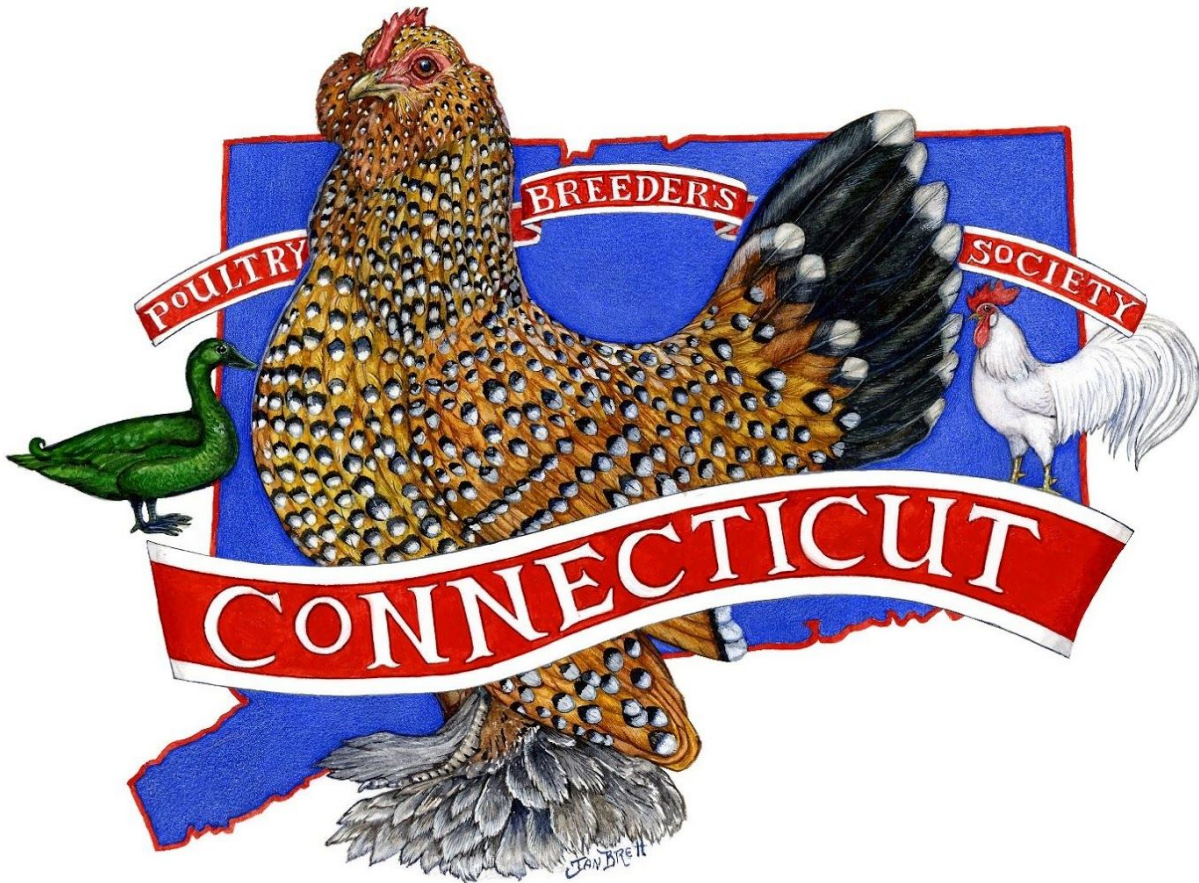

There will be a special presentation during the Connecticut Poultry Breeders Society show on June 9, 2019 to present the poultry to the youth.

Rules and Regulations

1. Entry must be postmarked no later than **May 17, 2019**.
2. Entry fee must accompany entry
3. **Entry fee is \$4.00 for open and \$3.00 for youth. Double cages are reserved for Standard birds only and are \$8.00/Double cage.**
4. **Mail entries to: Sarah Kmetetz at 139 Kasson Road, Bethlehem CT 06751.**
5. Any bird showing signs of sickness or disease will be removed from the show
6. Early coop out is prohibited. Anyone cooping out before awards are presented will forfeit all prizes and may be subjected to refusal of future entries
7. The club is not responsible for loss, accident or other damages you, your property or your entries
8. Classes will be cock, hen, cockerel, pullet
9. The poultry barn will be open at **7A.M.** on Sunday to receive entries; all entries must be cooped in by **9 A.M.** The barn will be open on Saturday from 3:00pm – 5:00pm to accept birds. If you arrive before 3:00pm, you will likely need to wait for our volunteers to finish setting up the show. If you arrive after 5:00pm, you will likely find a locked gate at the fairgrounds entrance.

10. Initial shavings will be in cages, bring your own if you feel you will need more.
11. All birds must have permanent Identification.

Health Requirements

Connecticut

POULTRY: Poultry originating within the state must come from healthy flocks with no evidence of infectious, contagious and/or communicable diseases. All birds must be inspected, identified and be accompanied by written proof (Connecticut Flock Test card or Connecticut Veterinary Medical Diagnostic Laboratory Report) that verifies that the breeding flock or the individual birds listed on the report were blood-test negative for *Salmonella pullorum* within 365 days of the show date. Concurrent Avian Influenza testing of the flock and/or individual birds is strongly recommended. Poultry vaccinated within 30 days with any live virus vaccine will be prohibited from showing. All cages, crates or vehicles used for housing or transporting poultry must be cleaned and disinfected before and after each show. **Doves, pigeons and waterfowl are exempt from testing but must be identified by leg bands or wing tags.**

Out of State

POULTRY: All poultry must be identified and test negative for *Salmonella pullorum* within 12 months of show date and be accompanied by the certificate. All poultry must comply with Department of Agriculture Avian Influenza requirements by originating from AI-free flocks or be tested for AI within 30 days of entry and have a certificate. No poultry from any areas of any state having Avian Influenza may enter Connecticut. Poultry vaccinated within 30 days with any live virus vaccine will be prohibited from showing. All cages, crates or vehicles used for housing or transporting poultry must be cleaned and disinfected before and after each show. **Doves, pigeons and waterfowl are exempt from testing but must be identified by leg bands or wing tags.**

Directions

The Fairgrounds address is: **30 Town House Road, Durham, CT 06422**. The Durham Fairgrounds is located at the junctions of Routes 68, 17 and 77 in Durham, CT.

From the Hartford Area (North): I91 South to exit 15 (Wallingford/Route 68) and follow the Durham Fair signs to the nearest parking lot.

From the New Haven Area (South): I91 North to Exit 15 (Wallingford/Route 68); at the end of the exit ramp turn right onto Route 68 and follow the Durham Fair signs to the nearest parking lot.

From the Shoreline Area (South): I95 to Exit 58 (Guilford); follow Route 77 North towards Durham and follow the Durham Fair signs to the nearest parking lot.

From the Waterbury Area (West): 84 East to 691 East to Route 66 to Route 147 and follow the Durham Fair signs to the nearest parking lot.
